Established in 1921, Saint Benedict School has educated four generations of young people. We strive to carry on that tradition today by providing the very best for each child.

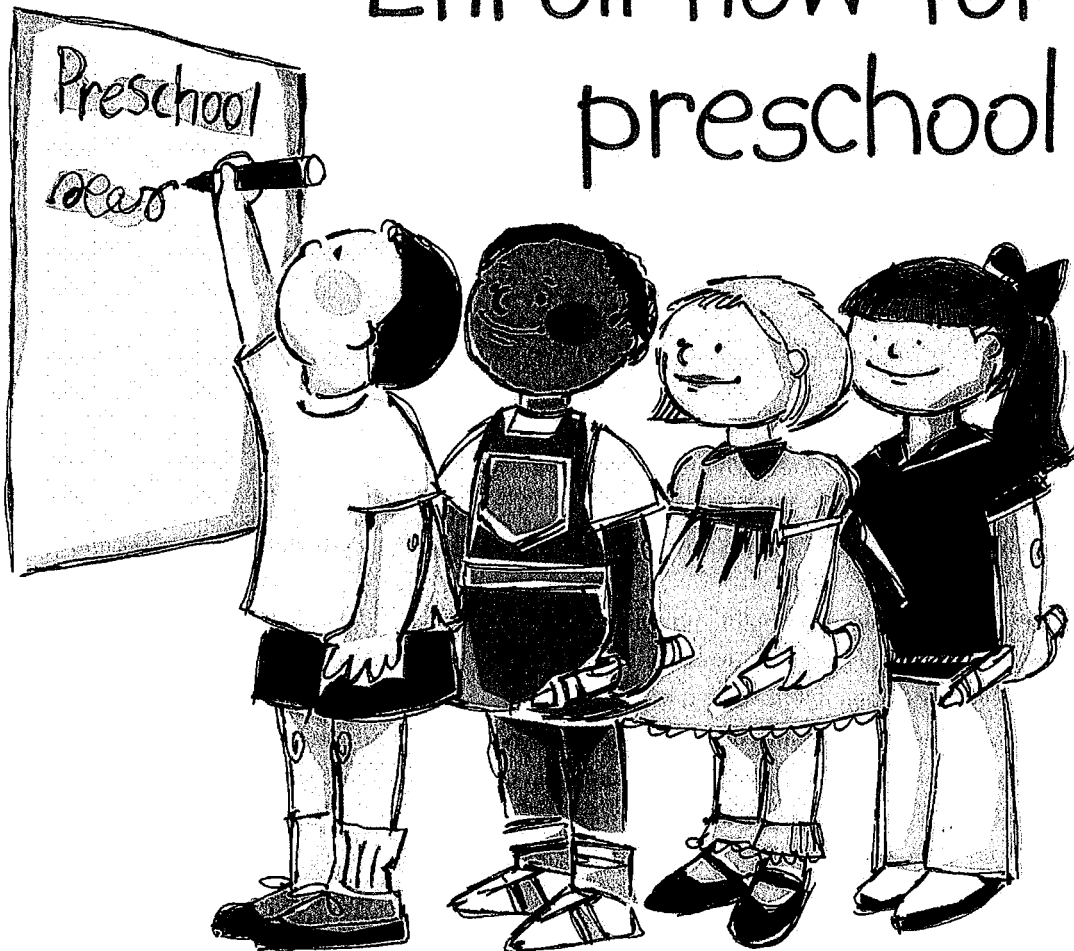

This is the parent involvement we wish to encourage, in order to foster a true partnership between our families and our school community. In particular, we hope that this first year within our school community will be a happy and exciting experience for both you and your child.

Beginning preschool is, as you know, an important step in your child's life. Every child is different. Every child is special, with special needs, special interests and special characteristics. Your child is important to you, and important to us, and we need to work together to help him or her to grow, learn and develop, both as an individual and as a member of our school community.

We believe that parents are the primary educators of their children and it is our task to work in union with you to help our children to be nurtured and continue to develop to their full potential during their time with us.

We hope this handbook will help you and your child to adjust readily and happily at this important time.

Our Philosophy for Preschool

We Believe

- ✓ children should be valued as individuals

Our Goals for Preschool

- To foster the development of a healthy self-image which will assist the children in regarding themselves as children of God, people who are important, good friends, good learners and eager participants in preschool and whole school activities
- To ensure that each child in our care feels safe, secure and loved
- To help each child develop an active curiosity about the world and an enthusiasm for learning based on his or her own personal satisfaction and involvement
- To build fundamental skills and acquire new information and knowledge
- To enable children to be expressive and creative through the use of language, physical activity, play materials, art and music
- To develop the "whole" child—socially, emotionally, spiritually, cognitively and physically
- To ensure that parents and teachers work together in the best interests of the individual child

All children attending St. Benedict School must be independently bathroom trained. We also encourage dressing them in clothing that permits them to use the restroom independently. (Avoiding complicated clothing, belts, suspenders, etc.)

Parent Information

Arrival and Departure

Arrive through the back door of the school between 7:40a.m. – 8:00a.m. Every child must be accompanied by an adult into the classroom each morning to assist them as they hang up their belongings and hand in anything that is due that day, though as the year progresses, children are expected to take care of their own belongings.

School will begin at 8:00am. Please be on time. Children often feel uncomfortable when they come in late. If your child is not going to attend, please call to let staff know. A contact number will be given out when enrolled.

Teachers will escort half day students to dismissal before lunch at 11:15 am and full day students at 2:45 pm. Half day students are dismissed at the Eggert door, full day students are dismissed from the Westfield doors. Our staff is hired to provide care services for a specific number of hours each day. It is important for parents to pick up their children at a designated time daily. If you find that you are going to be detained, please notify the school immediately so that we can assure your child that he/she has not been forgotten. Your child will then be taken up to the after school room where you will be charged for extended care.

Emergency Release Forms

At the beginning of the year parents will be asked to fill out an Emergency Release Form. These need to be filled out and returned for dismissal purposes. Children will be released to only to those who are designated on the Emergency Release Form. Children cannot be released to individuals under the age of 18. When someone other than the parent is to pick up a child, he or she will be asked to provide identification.

Curriculum

The curriculum at St. Benedict's is grouped in themes. We incorporate language arts, science, social studies, math and religion. The purpose of the curriculum is to bring your child to a better understanding of themselves in relation to God and to the world in which we live.

Literacy : Literacy in these years starts the development of reading and writing. Through literacy, your child will learn comprehension of words and reading strategies. Your child will also learn to make predictions and retell stories. Early literacy will help the child understand the conventions and functions of print. Goals of early literacy are to:

- Learn the alphabet and letter sounds
- Aid in the development of oral language,
- Enhance book awareness,
- Promote different types of literature,
- Foster an awareness of the connections between the spoken word and the written word.

Math: At the Pre-Kindergarten level, math is taught using manipulatives and through the use of art, music, and play. Math goals at this level are to identify numbers and count objects, encourage the use of mathematical concepts, to aid in the development of representational thought, to encourage the use of patterns, to promote measurement, and to encourage the use of reasoning skills. Other skills introduced are rational counting, one to one correspondence, sorting, classifying, sequencing, and size and shape awareness.

Motor Skills: Improving pencil grip/strength, learning to cut, etc.

Play: Play carries out an extremely important role in your child's learning and development. During play your child will learn communication, listening, awareness of change, social roles, risk taking, empathy, cooperation and respect for others. St. Benedict's Pre-Kindergarten program incorporates centers which allows for play-based learning.

Science: Science at the Pre-Kindergarten level is used to encourage natural curiosity and the use of reasoning skills. Science is hands on and allows your child to try new experiments. Skills taught in science are: properties, change, textures, measurement, cause and effect, classifying, collecting, observing and problem solving. These skills will be taught and reinforced with the following subjects: senses, weather, germs, foods, safety, and parts of body, water, animals and more.

Social sciences at this level are taught to help your child learn social and cognitive aspects of the world around him or her. Socially, your child will learn such concepts as cooperation, negotiation, and diversity through traditions and celebrations.

Religion: The Pre-Kindergarten religion curriculum is an overall introduction to God's creation, the church, holidays, and more. Children are also taught basic prayers.

Discipline Policy

Preventive Measures to Produce Acceptable Behavior: In order to maintain a happy, healthy, disciplined environment, the children are taught the importance of safety, care of property, good habits, rules of conduct and consideration and respect for others. Constructive methods of discipline are used to maintain group control

and handle individual behavior. Our main focus on discipline (defined as teaching or training) is preventative in nature, as we aim to build self-discipline in the child.

Constructive Measures to Extinguish Unacceptable Behavior: When a child exhibits unacceptable behavior or attitudes, he/she is instructed as to what is wrong and then directed to a positive alternative approach/behavior. Along with these new attitudes and behaviors, the child is guided in the direction of self-discipline by encouraging him/her to make as many decisions as possible within limits. We use a green/yellow/red stoplight behavior system in class to help children monitor their own progress throughout the day.

Outdoor Play Activities

Outdoor play is important to young children. Your children will spend time outside most days (weather and temperature permitting!) Please make sure that your child wears adequate clothing for all types of weather.

Specials

Art – Once a week

Music – Twice a week

Phys Ed – Twice a week

Library – Once a week

Technology – Once a week

Rest-Time

Students will rest for 45 minutes each day. This is required for all full-day students in pre-school. Children will be asked to lie quietly so that others may sleep if they wish. (We all need a little downtime!) Children may bring a towel or blanket and a small stuffed animal if they wish. Please refrain from bringing in action figures, Barbie dolls or other toys that may distract the children during this time. All nap items should be labeled and sent in on the first day of school.

There are a number of ways you can assist us in providing your child with the best possible education at preschool:

- ✓ Supporting and encouraging your child to develop a positive sense of self-worth
- ✓ Discussing any problems or worries directly with the teacher
- ✓ Support the Home School Association
- ✓ Reading the newsletters and emails

Our preschool aims to provide a program and environment that will assist the children begin to make a smooth transition from the naturalistic learning environment of the home to the more formal learning environment of the later years of primary school.

Parents are encouraged to participate in their child's learning at preschool. To do this effectively, it is important that the parents understand the educational objectives being pursued for their children.

We want to make sure that there's still money left over after preschool to give your child a good elementary, high school and college education. And despite being affordable, the preschool curriculum is one which also prepares the child educationally for those future years of schooling.

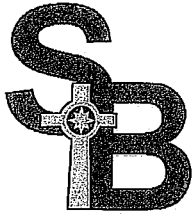
It is our hope that we can develop in each child a positive self-image and a love of learning and going to school. In our 3 year old program as well as our 4 year old program we provide many activities to do just that. Each activity that is presented to the children is a result of much planning. Children like to be actively involved. When more than one sense is used in teaching a task, learning is greatly improved.

Here at Saint Benedict's it is our commitment to children and their families that has earned us an outstanding reputation as leaders in education.

The 4-year-old program emphasizes kindergarten readiness and exploration. This program is designed to expand on the skills established in our 3-year-old program including socialization, independence, and group participation, and to prepare students for future elementary school experiences. Our engaging educational atmosphere is rich with discovery and possibility. Our goal is to encourage and challenge our students to become independent, enthusiastic learners.

We use a variety of instructional methods and developmentally appropriate activities to meet the varying cognitive, social and emotional needs of each individual child. To help prepare our students for upcoming kindergarten experiences, language and literacy activities further emphasize letter/sound relationships and are designed to promote reading readiness and encourage self-expression. As fine motor skills develop, art activities can be more complex. Quantitative, comparative, and more detailed concepts are introduced as students demonstrate increased memory and attention skills in the 4year-old program.

Our program is Monday through Friday from 8:00am - 2:45pm, with the option of a half day program that ends at 11:15am.

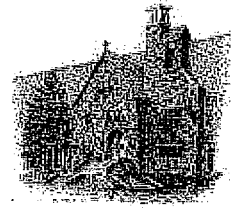

- Each (Pre-K) family is asked to sell 5 Dare-to-Dream fundraising tickets. All proceeds from this event go toward the cost of educating your child.
- Tuition is discounted the amount of our monthly processing fee (\$40) if you pay in full by August 7, 2018.
- All registered families not paying the full tuition by August 7th must enroll in our E-Tuition payment system. E-Tuition is an electronic payment system automatically transferring monthly tuition payments from your checking or savings account to St. Benedict's. The first E-Tuition payment is made Wednesday, August 15, 2018.

Financial Assistance: St. Benedict's School provides tuition assistance to families based on financial need. We continue to operate under the belief that no child should be denied a Catholic education for financial reasons. We are continuing the electronic tuition collection program for the 2018-19 school year. Everyone is required to fill out a new Tuition Authorization Form. Enclosed with this letter is the Tuition Authorization form.

Highlights of the 2018-19 tuition program

(See the back for more details.)

- All families must fill out and sign the Tuition Authorization Form.
- There are two choices for tuition payment. *(There are no exceptions.)*
 - Payment in full by August 7th. (Payment in full will receive a \$40.00 discount)
 - Payments monthly by electronic transfer from a checking/savings account.
- The Electronic Transfer option will begin on August 15th. See the back for more information.
- Student(s) will not be allowed in the school without a completed form.

Here is the timeline for the 2018-19 tuition program:

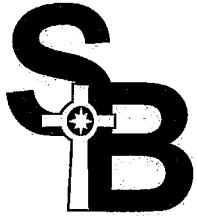
Feb 28	Bison Fund financial aid application due for families new to Bison.
April 1	Bison Fund requalification deadline for current Bison families.
April 1	Deadline for all returning families to register at \$125. The registration fee after April 1 st for any returning family will be \$175. (Required registration forms include Application, Tuition Authorization, Emergency Contact, and Registration Fee.)
June 30	Financial aid forms for St. Benedict Scholarship are due. (Bison Fund application is a prerequisite.)
July 31	Tuition bills are sent to all families with the amount owed for families who pay in full or with an electronic payment schedule for families choosing to pay monthly.
August 7	Payment in full is due. (\$40 discount to families who pay in full by August 7 th .)
August 15	First scheduled electronic payment. Payments will be deducted on the 15 th of every month for 10 months.
May 15	Families who do not sell the required number of Dare to Dream tickets will be billed for the unsold amount.

Our E-Tuition program was very successful last year. Our delinquency was very low. It is important that we collect tuition in a timely manner in order to maintain the financial stability of our school. Any question regarding the program should be directed to Scott Clare at the rectory (834-1041).

ELECTRONIC TRANSFER PROGRAM

1. Tuition payments will be divided over 10 months – August through May.
2. All payments will be withdrawn from a checking/savings account on the 15th of the month. When the 15th falls on a weekend, the transfer will occur on the following Monday.
3. In the event of insufficient funds a second transfer will be attempted on the 30th of the month.
4. In the event of a rejected transfer because of insufficient funds, all fees will be the responsibility of the school family. Fees will be added to the next scheduled transfer.
5. In the event of exceptional circumstances, requests for blocking of payment must be submitted by the 10th of the month.
6. Students entering during the school year will have their tuition payments prorated for the remaining months of the school year.
7. Students leaving the school will be responsible for the tuition for the remainder of the month in which they are leaving.

Additional Tuition Information

1. If a family chooses EFT for payment, all bank fees associated with rejected transfers for insufficient funds will be the responsibility of the school family.
2. In the event of an electronic funds transfer rejection on the 15th of the month, there will be a second attempt to transfer the funds on the 30th of the month. If that transfer is rejected, there will be a late fee of \$20.00 assessed for that amount to the account.
3. All families are responsible for the sale of 15 Dare to Dream fundraiser tickets. Any unsold tickets will be added to the tuition payment beginning in the month of May.
4. Continuous delinquency on tuition payment may result in removal of the student(s) from the school.
5. Families who enter the school during the school year will have their tuition payments prorated based on the remaining months in the school year.
6. Families who leave the school during the school year will receive a prorated refund for any tuition paid in advance.
7. Registration and Technology fees are non-refundable.
